From The Executive Director's Desk: A Look Back At 2021

As I look back at 2021, I didn't expect another full year of dealing with COVID as the headliner. I did not realize 2020 was going to be a trilogy.

Everyone has had their difficulties with this virus. It has affected us all in different ways. Trying to stay ahead of the virus has become a difficult challenge.

At the MDA, we continually monitor the new guidelines, along with vaccine and workforce issues.

Besides dealing with COVID issues, the MDA board and staff have been busy working on your behalf in 2021.

Legislation – MDA had a successful legislative session. Included in the biennial budget was a comprehensive adult dental benefit for MaineCare patients and a fee increase for dental services. Since 1989, there have been minor increases to a very limited number of dental fees. This budget includes a comprehensive dental benefit, including preventive services and dentures, and further includes funding to begin the long overdue work of implementing a more equitable payment process for MaineCare dental services. MDA members are currently working with the Shareholder Committee (MAC Submcommittee on Dentistry) to develop the new administrative rules, which will take effect on July 1, 2022.

The MDA, along with a host of other organizations, did a great deal of work on LD 996, *An Act to Improve Dental Health Access for Maine Children and Adults with Low Incomes,* which passed unanimously in committee. Gov. Mills chose several bipartisan initiatives to include in the budget, and LD 966 was one of those initiatives.

Of the 13 bills carried over by the Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services Committee, two were dental-related: LD 665 – An Act to Promote Better Dental Care for Cancer Survivors and LD 1266 – An Act to Improve the Value of Dental Insurance (MLR). The Committee on Government Relations is continuing to advocate for these two pieces of legislation in the upcoming 2022 legislative session.

A complete listing of legislation the MDA is following appears in the Legislative Updates section of the MDA website.

Continuing dental education – A new continuing dental education curriculum was introduced in 2021 where members have a chance to discuss treatment plans using the information learned from the lecture. This new curriculum has been highly successful, giving members a chance to discuss treatment plans using the information learned from the previous lecture.

The committee had hopes of gathering members in three to four regional locations, and this worked quite well the first time around. With COVID numbers increasing and the opportunity to involve more members, the MDA's CE Committee pivoted to an online-only treatment planning session for this month.

Creating a stronger board and committees – Under the guidance of the MDA President Dr. Keeling and the Board of Directors, a board orientation was presented by myself and the MDA's attorney in September. The board has been tackling lots of difficult issues, and it was decided the board would go through formal on-boarding training during the first meeting of the newly elected board.

In efforts to keep committees active and effective, meetings have been scheduled monthly and new members who are willing to serve have been added to the committees. If you are interested in joining any of the committees, please send me an e-mail. The MDA is always looking for members interested in serving their profession. The board also added a communications task force in hopes of making it a standing

committee. This task force was developed in hopes to raise our social media awareness.

Workforce issues – A task force was developed to investigate ways to help our members with the nationwide workforce shortage crisis. This task force hit the ground running and has been busy the last few months. Letters were sent out to all the high school counselors, creating awareness of dental auxiliary careers and to contact MDA if students were interested in pursuing such a career path.

The task force is investigating the development of radiology courses for dental staff, toolkit for office managers, and growing class size at established dental auxiliary programs across the state.

Executive director search – A task force was developed to find the next permanent executive director. The task force has been busy searching and interviewing candidates, and hoped to present their finalist to the Board at their January meeting.

Policies – A task force was developed to review bylaws and policies, and will give suggested updates and revisions at the annual membership meeting.

I wish you a healthy and successful 2022.

News from the First District Trustee's Corner



Three Periods

Happy New Year! As your friend and first district trustee, I hope each of you had an opportunity to take some time off, relax, and spend time with your loved ones during the holidays. We now enter what we expect to be a busy winter, with Yankee Dental Congress, NEDLC, Lobby Day and state annual meetings rapidly approaching during the first half of the year. A great deal is on our plate while we continue to work during an uncertain pandemic. Here are just a few of the issues on which we are currently focusing:

FIRST PERIOD: As you know, the ADA was successful in articulating to the US House of Representatives our pragmatic platform on a Medicare dental benefit (which was proposed in the House version of the "Build Back Better" bill). In the end, the House passed the bill without any dental benefit proposal included. At the time of this writing, the Senate is working on its own version, but thanks again to the continued advocacy of dentists like you, senators are well aware of our proposal. It may take months for the Senate and House to reconcile their respective versions, but organized dentistry continues to make a positive impact on Capitol Hill.

While we are discussing Medicare, the ADA is actively engaging Senators on Medicaid. In early December, ADA sent a letter to Sen. Ben Cardin (D-Maryland), throwing our support behind his "Medicaid Dental Benefits Act of 2021" (S.3166). This important bill, which would require comprehensive dental Medicaid coverage in every state, speaks directly to the second portion of the ADA Mission Statement, advocating for the public oral health. With the number of Medicaid-enrolled and eligible patients increasing significantly during the pandemic, policymakers need to take critical steps to bolster our state safety net programs. Everyone, regardless of their financial status, needs to see a dentist regularly!

SECOND PERIOD: Vaccinations continue across the globe, although this important public health initiative has sadly

become politically charged in many circles. However, as oral health professionals, we must remain above such unnecessary and unproductive rhetoric.

As has been the case since vaccines were first made available a year ago, the ADA strongly encourages every dental professional to get vaccinated and boostered. We avoided in-office outbreaks thus far because we embraced the science and acted appropriately to protect ourselves, our co-workers, and our patients. We must also continue to educate both patients and our own staffs on getting vaccinated. Remember my saying: "Get it, give it, share it." Finally, we must remain committed to the protocols that science shows work to minimize the risk of exposure.

Dr. Leslie Fang and Dr. Leonard Hess will be offering day-long courses at the event.

In dentistry, his textbooks "Principles and Practice of Oral Medicine" and "Oral Medicine Secrets" are widely known. He also co-authored the interactive DVD "Antibiotics in Dentistry." His publications "The Ultimate Cheat Sheets: A Practical Guide for the Dentist," were named Educational Product of the Year by Clinicians' Report every year from 2007 to 2015.

Dr. Hess will present "Treatment Planning for Functional Esthetics: A Protocol for Predictability and Profitability" on Saturday, May 21, where attendees will learn a protocol for complete diagnosis, treatment planning, provisional verification, and successful esthetic results.

Dr. Hess is co-clinical director at The Dawson Academy and practices full time in addition to teaching continuing education courses. He is a member of the editorial board for Inside Dentistry and has had more than 17 articles published in peer-reviewed journals. He has been teaching continuing education courses since 2005 on topics such as occlusion, smile design, treatment planning, preparation design, and practice integration of complete dentistry. He's taught all-day continuing education courses at the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry national meeting, the Greater New York Dental Meeting, Pacific Dental Conference, Ontario Dental Association meeting, and the Yankee Dental Congress. He has also taught courses in Japan, Germany, Poland, China, and Canada.

Gov. Janet Mills announced in December the Maine Veterans' Dental Network will resume its dental services in the New Year for Maine veterans who otherwise cannot afford them.

"My administration is committed to doing all we can to serve and honor our service members," said Gov. Mills.

Gov. Mills launched MVDN in 2021 in partnership with Northeast Delta Dental, participating dental clinics, and Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC). The network began providing services on May 15 with an initial grant of \$35,000 from Northeast Delta Dental. Northeast Delta Dental has now provided a \$100,000 grant to allow MVDN to continue its services.

Any veteran who is a Maine resident, is not 100 percent service-connected to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), doesn't have dental insurance, cannot afford to pay for dental care out of pocket, has a DD-214 showing an honorable or general under honorable conditions discharge, and/or deployed on active duty for at least 180 days with the Maine Army National Guard or Air Guard, or retired from the National Guard with 20 years of service meets the criteria to access the grant-funded program.

WHO QUALIFIES FOR ASSISTANCE?

Veterans must meet the following criteria to access the grant-funded Maine Veterans' Dental Network:

- MAINE RESIDENT
- IS NOT 100 PERCENT SERVICE-CONNECTED TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS (VA)
- DOESN'T HAVE DENTAL INSURANCE
- CANNOT AFFORD TO PAY FOR DENTAL CARE OUT OF POCKET
- HAS A DD-214 SHOWING AN HONORABLE OR GENERAL UNDER HONORABLE CONDITIONS DISCHARGE, AND/OR DEPLOYED ON ACTIVE DUTY FOR AT LEAST 180 DAYS WITH THE MAINE ARMY NATIONAL GUARD OR AIR GUARD, OR RETIRED FROM THE NATIONAL GUARD WITH 20 YEARS OF SERVICE

Veterans' Dental Network participating clinics and FQHCs include Community Dental; Lincoln County Dental; Kennebec Valley Family Dentistry; Waterville Community Dental; UNE Dental Clinic, the UMA Dental Clinic; Eastport Health Care; and Fish River Rural Health.

Veterans who would like to receive services must first connect with Sarah Sherman, director of strategic partnerships at the Maine Bureau of Veterans Services, at sarah.sherman@ maine.gov.

"One of my favorite veteran interactions

came early in the program when I informed a Vietnam Era veteran that he qualified for the program and his response was, 'Do you mean to tell me that I will be able to smile at my daughter's wedding in August?'" Sherman said.

"Having the capacity to respond with 'yes' made both his day and mine, and all the hard work over the past year extremely worthwhile."

ADA Restarts Third Party Payer Concierge

ADA NEWS

The ADA restarted its Third Party Payer Concierge service earlier this month after a year-long hiatus.

The service, which assists dentists with insurance questions and concerns with third party payers, is for member dentists only and can be accessed by calling 1-800-621-8099 or emailing dentalbenefits@ada.org.

The program will be evaluated after a five-year period, according to a resolution passed by the 2021 ADA House of Delegates.

"This service provides much-needed assistance for dentists with insurancerelated questions and concerns that they cannot find elsewhere. Even though many dentists' issues come down to contractual obligations, the ADA can provide education on the nuances of doing business with dental insurance companies and how to empower themselves to make decisions that are best for their patients and their practices," said Dr. Mark Johnston, chair of the ADA Council on Dental Benefit Programs' Dental Benefit Information Subcommittee

"Coordination of benefits is a constant source of confusion for many dental offices, and the concierge will be able to help answer questions and address concerns regarding COB. Another common concern from dental offices involves claim denials. While the concierge may not be able to get a claim paid for you, it can provide assistance with the appeals process. Lastly, dentists have reported concerns with poorly written explanation of benefits statements, and the concierge can also help dentists with EOB language questions as well," Dr. Johnston said.

"Sealants on permanent molars reduce the risk of caries by 80 percent," Dr. Hilton said.

"If your dentist recommends dental sealants, it is part of a comprehensive caries management approach. I am excited that this year's National Children's Dental Health Month theme is about dental sealants, so more families are aware of this cavity-preventing treatment."

National Children's Dental Health Month began as a one-day event in Cleveland, Ohio, on February 3, 1941.


The American Dental Association held the first national observance of Children's Dental Health Day on February 8, 1949. The single-day observance became a week-long event in 1955.
